UNIQUE DESIGN TRAITS

Unique trillion-cut alexandrite has intense, nearly 100% color-change, with report stating Brazilian origin, making it an incredibly rare gemstone.

The trillion alexandrite is surrounded by a halo of rose-cut diamonds, and further accented by a scalloped alexandrite halo to create a delicate petaled shape.

The overall size of the pendant makes it a great piece to transition from day to night.

GEMSTONE DETAILS


Alexandrite

Alexandrite is one of the most unique and rare gemstones ever discovered. Naturally, it changes colors in different lighting, from hues of greens and blues in daylight to reds and purples in incandescent light. Alexandrite was discovered in April of 1834 in the Ural Mountains of Russia. It was named after Tsar Alexander II since it was discovered around the time of the future Tsar's coming of age.

Since red and green were the colors of Imperial Russia it quickly became the national stone of Russia, worn by royalty and nobility. Today, fine alexandrite from Russia is very rare and mostly found in older estate pieces. In 1987 a new deposit of Alexandrite was discovered in Minas Gerais, Brazil. Although there are other areas where Alexandrite has been found, Brazil has been the finest source for alexandrite seen since the 19th century. The most important factor in determining the value of an Alexandrite is the color change: the more dramatic the shift, the higher the value. Alexandrite is a birthstone for June and the gem for the 55th wedding anniversary.
